Our aim is to see that very soon, we secure the land and lay the foundation stone of PIC.

In the course of this past year, we have significantly increased our membership strength. ## Idea of PIC

As you are aware, Pune has always been a city of learning, scholarship, liberal values, enlightened thinking and action. The city today prides itself of the presence of thought leaders from all walks of life. What this great city had missed though was a meeting point for all such great minds, a place where in an intellectually stimulating and peaceful environment, enlightened discussions and debates can be held about the future of this great city, of this great nation and indeed the world. Other cities have such meeting places. In New Delhi, for example, India International Centre (IIC) provides such an ambience. Over the past fifty or so years, it has played a unique cultural and intellectual role in the life of the citizens. In Goa, there is International Centre, Goa (ICG). Then there is the Bangalore International Centre.

Three individuals with a distinguished record of public service in India and abroad – Dr. Raghunath Mashelkar, Dr. Vijay Kelkar and Dr. Dileep Padgaonkar conceived the idea of an international centre in Pune. ## Programmes (FY 2012-13)

### Art & Culture

#### The Inner Path: A Festival of Buddhist Films (1st – 3rd June 2012)

In the true spirit of 'network of networks', PIC organised the first ever film festival on Buddhism in association with NFAI (National Film Archive of India), BORI (Bhandarkar Oriental Research Institute) and NETPAC. The festival was inaugurated by the noted actor Mr. Kabir Bedi.

The festival was graced by the presences of Mr. Suresh Jindal, Producer and Chairman, Devki Foundation and Dr. Aruna Vasudev, Founder and Director, NETPAC.

It was attended by a jam packed audience for all the 10 films screened at the festival that focused on the life, times and principles of the Buddha. Along with the films, an exhibition of ancient Buddhist texts was held by BORI.

Following the festival, a panel discussion was organized at Symbiosis International University, institutional member of PIC, on 'Relevance of Buddhism in Today's World'. This was chaired by Mr. Bedi and moderated by Dr. Dileep Padgaonkar, Chairperson, Program Committee.

#### Bangladesh War of Liberation on Celluloid (12th – 14th October, 2012)

After the success of Buddhist Film Festival, PIC organised another Film Festival on the Bangladesh war of liberation in association with National Film Archive of India (NFAI). The Film Festival highlighted the plight of the people of Bangladesh, during the nine month civil war.

Given the geo-political relations and India's role in Bangladesh liberation, the film festival had significant following both by Bangla and Non Bangla speaking audience.

It was inaugurated by eminent film maker Ms. Sai Paranjape in the presence of Mr. Mahbub Hassan Saleh, Deputy High Commissioner of Bangladesh. It was followed by the screening of film Matir Moina (The Clay Bird, 2002) directed by Tareque Masud.

In all, six films were shown in three days including 'Amar Bandhu Rasheed', based on a story by Muhammed Zafar, Iqbal Tauquir's 'Joyjatra', based on Amjad Hossain's Novel 'Obelay Osomoy', 'A Few Shattered Tales and Guerilla', which was a box office hit in Bangladesh.

These films showcased the resistance offered by the freedom fighters, the role played by a woman in the freedom struggle and also the complexity of the cultural aspects of the country.

#### Poorva Ranga 2012, Tribute to Sachin Dev Burman (29th October 2012)

Pune International Centre and Maharashtra State Employees Cultural Association paid a tribute to the legendary music composer Sachin Dev Burman by jointly organizing a musical program. The event took place on the occasion of Kojagiri Purnima.

Sachin Dev Burman, popularly known as Burman da, was one of the most respected and successful music



composer for Hindi and Bengali movies. The program was an amalgamation of multimedia presentation of Hindi songs and performance by noted artists Manjushree Oak, Prashant Nasire & others.

## Book Releases

### 'Making News, Breaking News, Her Own Way' (7th July 2012)

In association with the Symbiosis International University, PIC organised the launch of the book Making News, Breaking News, Her Own Way edited by Latika Padgaonkar and Shubha Singh on the lives and work of some exceptional women journalists of our time, who have redefined and given a whole new meaning to what constitutes news, in terms of values and themes. The groundbreaking work done by these journalists won them the prestigious Chameli Devi Jain Award for Outstanding Women Media Persons. The book was released by eminent journalist Mr. Kumar Ketkar, Founding Member of PIC and Chief Editor of the Marathi Daily, Dainik Divya.

The book release was followed by a panel discussion among three awardees: The panelists were Ms. Latika Padgaonkar, co-author of the book and Founding Member of PIC, journalist, educationist and activist, Ms. Teesta Setelvad, media researcher and author Ms. Sevanti Ninan, and activist, author and columnist Ms. Vinita Deshmukh. The discussion was moderated by Mr. Kumar Ketkar.

### 'Bol Mahamanavache' by Dr. Narendra Jadhav (26th November 2012)

In association with Pune University and Janseva Foundation, PIC organised a Book Release of 'Bol Mahamanavache'. It's a compilation of 500 speeches of Bharat Ratna Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar translated and edited by Dr. Narendra Jadhav, Trustee of PIC, Member of Planning Commission and Former Vice-Chancellor of Pune University. ## Reinventing India Lecture Series

### Round-Table on 'Energy & Environment Dilemma and its Impact on National Security' (2nd August 2012)

Perceptions of National Security are changing in the modern interconnected world where all-out conventional war between nations may no longer be affordable for any nation. New non-traditional threats such as fierce competition for energy, water, food and effects of climate changes are emerging as grave threats for human societies and nations in the future.

It is in this context that PIC organised a 'Round-Table' to create an informed debate on this multi-dimensional subject with a view to evolve a policy advisory paper for the consideration of the Government for a long-term sustainable plan to address India's energy security imperatives and safeguard its national security interests.

The round table was chaired by Dr. Arvind Gupta, DG, IDSA, Delhi and the panelist included Prof Amitav Mallik, Former Member, NSAB, Gen SCN Jatar (Rtd.), President, Nagarik Chetana Manch, Prof Arun Dalvi, Director, NISDA, Prof Sanjeev Ghotge, Jt. Director, WISE, AM Bhushan Gokhale (Rtd.), Adviser to PSA & DG, DRDO. More than 80 distinguished energy experts were in attendance for the round table. Former President of India, Hon. Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam addressed the final session attended by over 400 attendees, including the energy experts.

Among other things, Hon. Dr. Kalam shared his vision of a dream city. "The profile of my dream city is that it should have a population of not more than five million, it should generate its own power through green sources, it should be vibrant economy where everyone has access to clean energy, clean water, where everyone use bio fuel and a city that is full if parks and trees."

### First Foundation Day (24th September 2012)

PIC celebrated its first anniversary. The occasion was graced by the President, Centre for Policy Research, Dr. Pratap Bhanu Mehta. He delivered a lecture on 'Statecraft and Governance in India'.

He highlighted the old governance system in India with its six tenets namely:

- I) Vertical Accountability
- II) Relative Secrecy
- III) Wide Discretion
- IV) Excessive Centralisation
- V) Relative Fixed Political Economy
- VI) Small State (Impact on Citizen Well being)

He appealed for change in the governance platform. He emphasized that this governance revolution can succeed only with underlying revolution towards 'liberal ideas'. Such new governance platform will have healthy balance between the Government and the Society and in turn of their expectation from each other.

On this first foundation day ceremony, Dr. Dileep Padgaonkar, Chairperson, Programme committee updated the attendees on the events conducted over the last year and plans for near future. Also, a presentation was delivered by Prof. Christopher Benninger, Hon. Trustee of PIC and a world renowned architect on the planned facilities for the proposed PIC Campus. The session was concluded by felicitation of PIC Members, who had received Padma Awards. They included Mr. Arun Firodia, Dr. S B Mujumdar, Dr. K H Sancheti & Ms. Anu Aga.



#### Road Map for Fiscal Consolidation by Dr. Vijay Kelkar (9th October 2012)

PIC in association with Maharashtra Chamber of Commerce, Industries and Agriculture (MCCIA) organised a talk by eminent economist, Dr. Vijay Kelkar on the 'Roadmap for Fiscal Consolidation', which he submitted to the Hon'ble Finance Minister, Mr. P Chidambaram in September 2012.

Dr. Kelkar, Vice President, PIC, Former Finance Secretary, GoI was also the Chairman of the 13th Finance Commission. He is the Chairman of India Development Foundation (IDF) and Chairman at Janwani, MCCIA.

Dr. Kelkar highlighted on the strategies suggested by Kelkar Committee to reduce the Fiscal Deficit leading to a virtuous cycle accelerating GDP, growth & employment. Also, restructuring of government balance sheet by selling underperforming assets. According to the committee's report, revenue generated can be used in building urban infrastructure, carrying out reforestation and making rivers clean, which in turn will generate employment. According to Dr. Kelkar, giving employment is the greatest example of inclusive growth.

#### 'Financial Infrastructure' by Mr. Deepak Parekh, Chairman High Level Committee (20th October 2012)

PIC in association with MCCIA organised a special talk by Mr. Deepak Parekh, Chairman – High Level Committee on 'Financial Infrastructure'. The panel headed by Mr. Deepak Parekh submitted the committee report to Hon. Prime Minister in October 2012. The committee was mandated to review existing policies and suggest necessary changes in the investment framework in the high priority infrastructure sector.

This committee has made recommendations relating to financing of the projected investment of \$ 1 trillion during the 12th Five Year Period (2012–17). Dr. Parekh highlighted salient features of the report with PIC and MCCIA members. He emphasized importance of the involvement of private participation to meet the estimate of \$1 trillion investment in infrastructure during the 12th plan period. According to him, the govt. will have to shed its 'business as usual' stance. Service sector contributes 68% of the GDP. It has been growing at the rate of 8–9% and the difficulty is in the manufacturing sector, as it has de-grown.

#### 'Challenges as Opportunities: The Experience of Liberalizing the Indian Economy' by Hon'ble Finance Minister Mr. P Chidambaram on (24th November 2012)

Hon'ble Finance Minister Mr. P Chidambaram delivered a lecture on 'Challenges as Opportunities: The Experience of Liberalizing the Indian Economy' on PIC platform. Addressing some of the challenges that the Indian Economy is facing and how we can convert them into opportunities.

FM demonstrated his commitment to implement Kelkar Committee Report in best possible manner. He highlighted that, the current account deficit is a huge challenge. FDI is the most preferred option to reduce deficit as the money would come to India and it would stay in the country. He also highlighted government's plans to pay beneficiaries directly via banks and reduce leaks even further.

This event was attended by approximate 500 people, who included students, scholars, corporates and many others. This event was chaired by our honorary member, Mr. Rahul Bajaj.

#### Round Table on Solar Photo Voltaic (6th February 2013)

Pune International Centre and Prayas Energy Group (PEG), an institutional member of PIC joined hands to organise a 'Round-Table on Solar Photo-Voltaic Power' to generate an informed debate in two select areas that deserve more focus. These were:

- I) Aggressive adoption of Roof-Top Solar PV for distributed electricity generation &

- II) Promotion of domestic SPV manufacturing sector to meet rising domestic demand as well as to compete globally.

The deliberation was aimed to help evolve valuable policy recommendations for more ambitious solar energy performance in India. The round table was chaired by Mr. Girish Pradhan, Former Secretary, MNRE, GoI and co chaired by Mr. Ajit Nimbalkar, Trustee, PIC and Former Chief Secretary, GoM. The panelist included, Prof Amitav Mallik, Founding Member of PIC, and Former Member, NSAB, Mr. K Subramanya, Former CEO, TATA BP Solar, Mr. Pradeep Bhargava, Founder Member, PIC and Former Chairman, CII and Mr. Ashwin Gambhir, Sr. Research Associate, PEG.

The deliberation highlighted:

- I) Effective implementation of national Solar Mission and role of various financial organizations in providing support for production of domestic Photo Voltaic and
- II) The role of distribution companies to ensure uniform distribution of solar energy across the country.







## Infrastructure

- A central, enclosed garden-plaza will accommodate a small amphitheatre, plants and al fresco café. It is the connecting element of the design, bringing people informally together.
- These facilities shall include a number of galleries and exhibition halls that can also be used as meeting rooms, or for small dance and music recitals.
- There will be an auditorium that accommodates four hundred people for lectures, dramas, films and dance. A large convention hall that will be divisible down into three seminar rooms or combinations thereof.
- There shall be a library, a computer centre, a yoga centre, and the PIC secretariat.



- There will be an ATM, a gourmet café and fine dining facilities. There will be scholar's guest house for visiting scientists, writers, artists and musicians. There will be about forty comfortable rooms and two suites.
- A modern kitchen will facilitate all the three activities.
- The facility will include infrastructure and amenities like rest rooms, fire stairs and fire fighting, elevators, air handling unit rooms, housekeeping and maintenance engineers offices. There will be podium parking for about three hundred cars.
- The structure will be constructed from durable, fire resistant materials that are easy to maintain. Warm natural colors and vibrant art works will set the tone.

### I. Corporate Governance

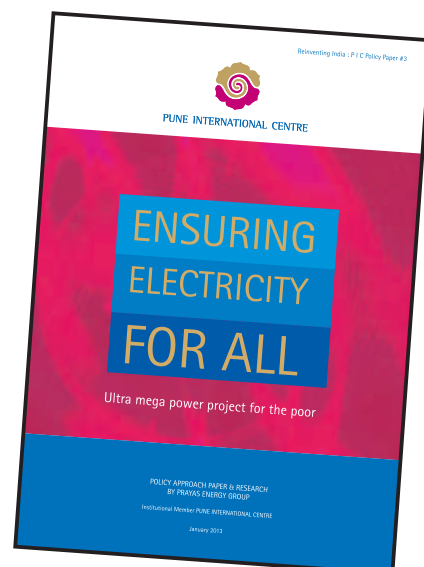

### II. 'Ensuring Electricity For All'

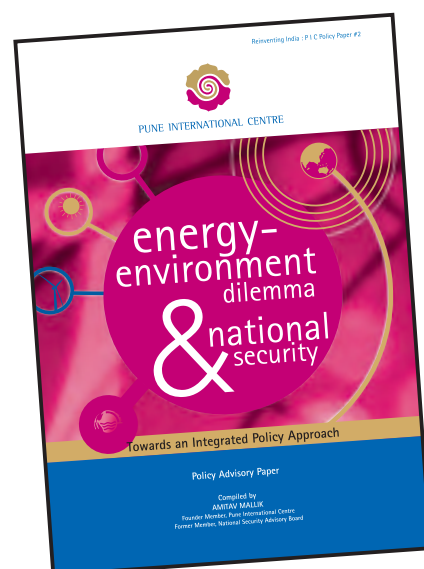
Prayas Energy Group and Pune International Centre (PIC) jointly organized a roundtable on "Electricity For All: Challenges and Approaches" on 18th February 2012 at YASHDA in Pune. Former Union Minister of Power, Shri. Sushil Kumar Shinde was the chief guest while veteran social leader Shri. N. D. Patil was the chairman. Dr. Pramod Deo, Chairman, CERC and Shri. Ashok Lavasa, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Power was also present. The main agenda was to discuss challenges and approaches to ensure electrification for all households in India. This has led to a discussion paper titled 'Ensuring Electricity For All'. The paper argues that for ensuring electricity for all, supply is as important as providing connection. It proposes restructuring of Rajiv Gandhi Gramin Vidyutikaran Yojana (RGGVY) and making available low cost power to distribution companies to fulfil national commitment of Electricity for All.



### III. 'Energy & Environment Dilemma and its Impact on National Security'

Climate changes due to global warming and increasing demand of human society are clearly the two major concerns of the future that can affect global peace and stability. PIC organized a round-table seminar on the subject of 'Energy & Environment Dilemma and its Impact on National Security' on 2nd August 2012 at Pune to bring focus on the need to recognize the complexity of this multi-dimensional problem and to evolve a policy advisory paper to highlight the urgent actions required to address the combined threat to national security.

The round-table discussion was attended by over 80 participants where several experts shared their well-informed views and former President of India, Dr. Kalam addressed the final session attended by over 400 people.





Dr. Kalam was very pleased to note that PIC has combined the energy and environment issues together and also discussing impacts to national security as it is important to understand the inter-connections. He spoke on the importance of India achieving 'Energy Independence' to minimise the dependence on carbon fuels and advised a 'mission-mode' approach to maximise the contribution of green and renewable energy in India with an ambitious target for 2030. He also dwelled on how India's energy needs may double by 2030 and how renewable energy sources can meet this extra requirement of over 200,000 Mega-Watts, if supported by innovative R&D and timely investments.

Congratulating PIC for the initiative, he suggested that thought leaders in Pune should aim to make Pune a carbon neutral city and spoke of how green cities can make a major contribution to environmental protection for the whole country as also for the world. Appreciating the PIC initiative, he advised greater participation of younger minds.

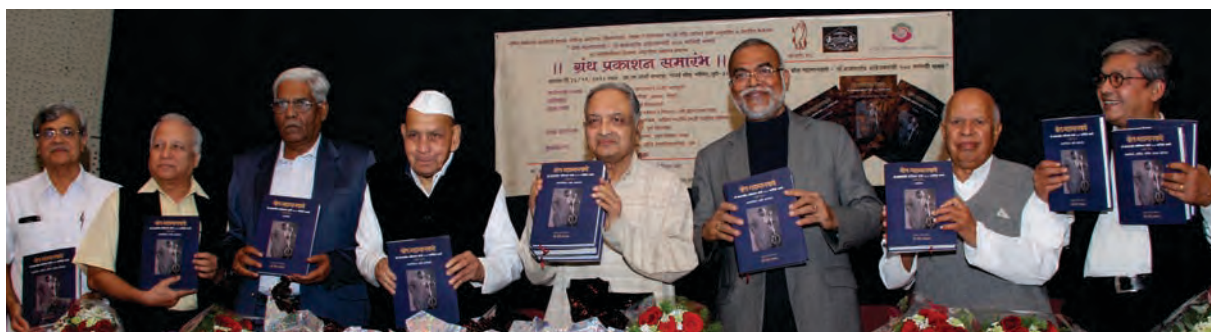
